

Level of Function

Our veterans gained more independence in their mobility while in our rehab program compared to other VAs.




Discharge Destination

- 82% discharged to home/community
- 14% discharged to subacute rehabilitation
- 2% discharged to long term care
- 1% with unplanned transfers to acute hospital

Achieving Goals

93% of our veterans felt the progress they made in rehab met their expectations.




Patient Satisfaction Survey

- In every category of patient satisfaction, we were above the national benchmark by at least 2%
- 98% reporting they would recommend facility to family and friends in time of need

Length of Stay

Our veterans are ready to go home sooner. Our length of stay is 9 days shorter than other VAs!



Maintaining Level of Function

95% of our veterans maintained the benefits of rehab participation when interviewed 90 days after discharge.
